  - [Needle Felting Foam](#) size 10x7 or larger is ideal

- Iron, small sharp scissors, awl, glue is optional

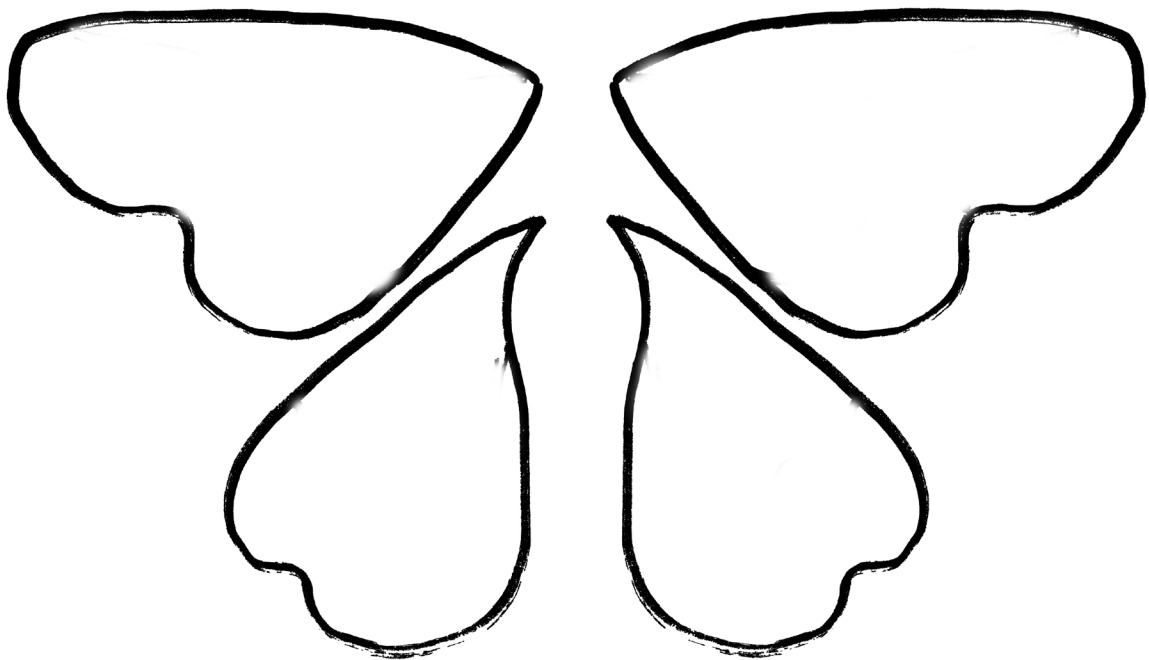
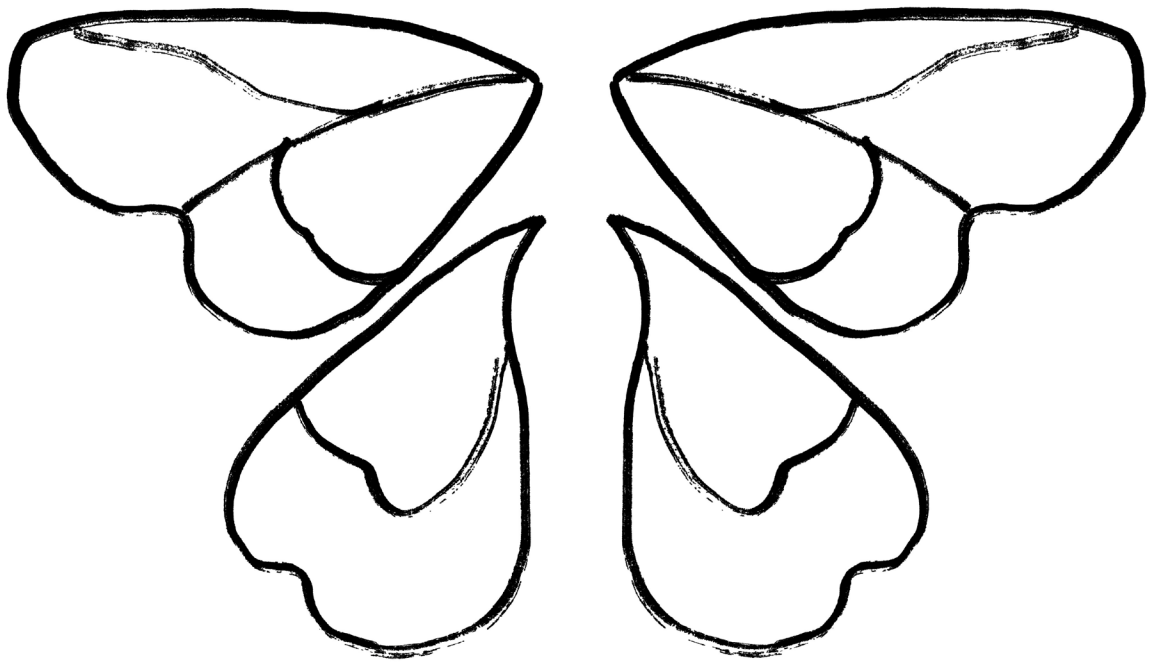
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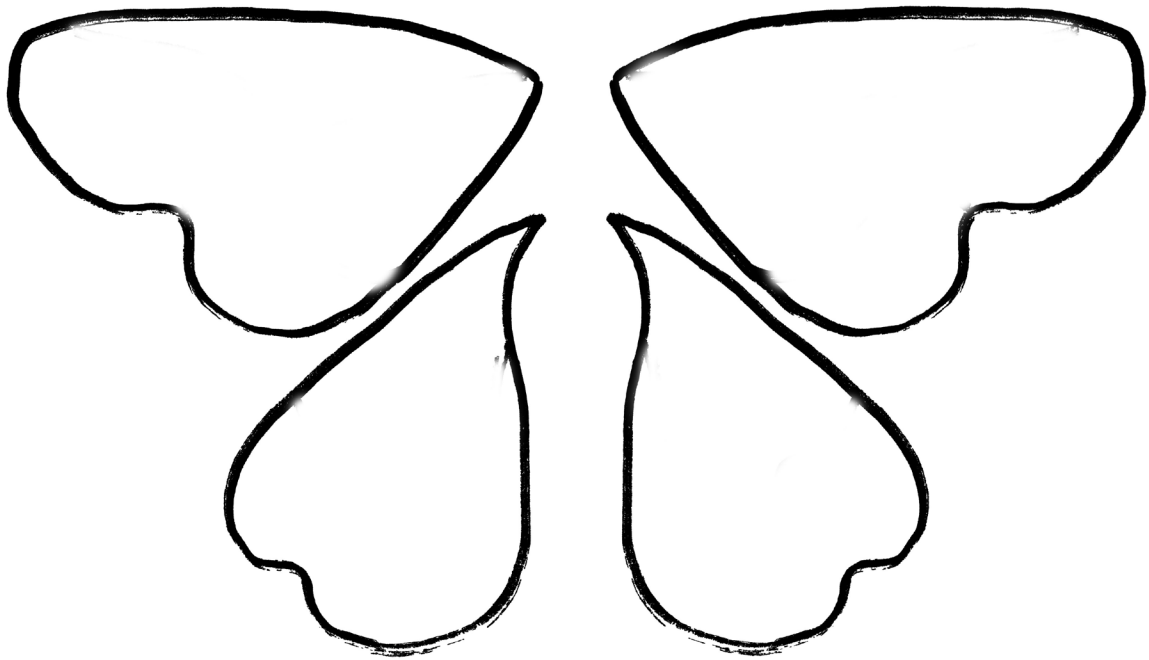
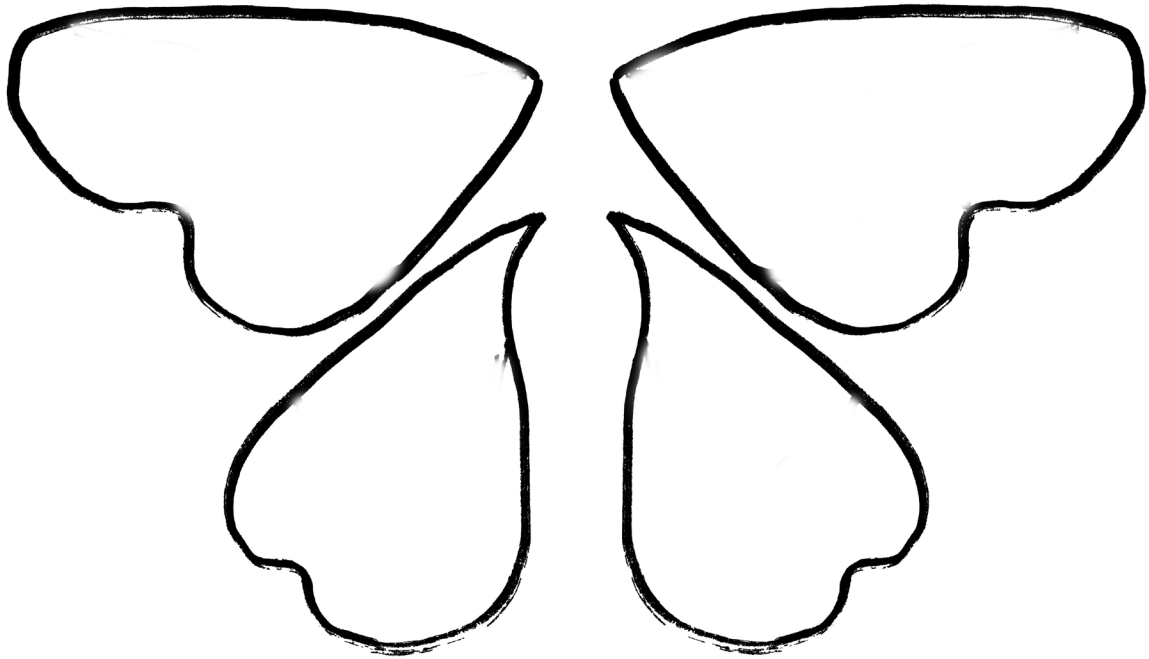


Print butterfly wing pattern using your home printer and regular paper.

Trace over the wings with the iron-on transfer pen.

Place design face down on your wool felt or fabric of choice.

Hold hot dry iron on back of paper for 20sec in each spot, until all areas of the pattern are transferred. You will see the ink more prominently through the back of the paper once it is transferred.



Have fun drawing your wing details and playing with different designs.
