

Simple Shiny Pumpkin Wet Felting Project

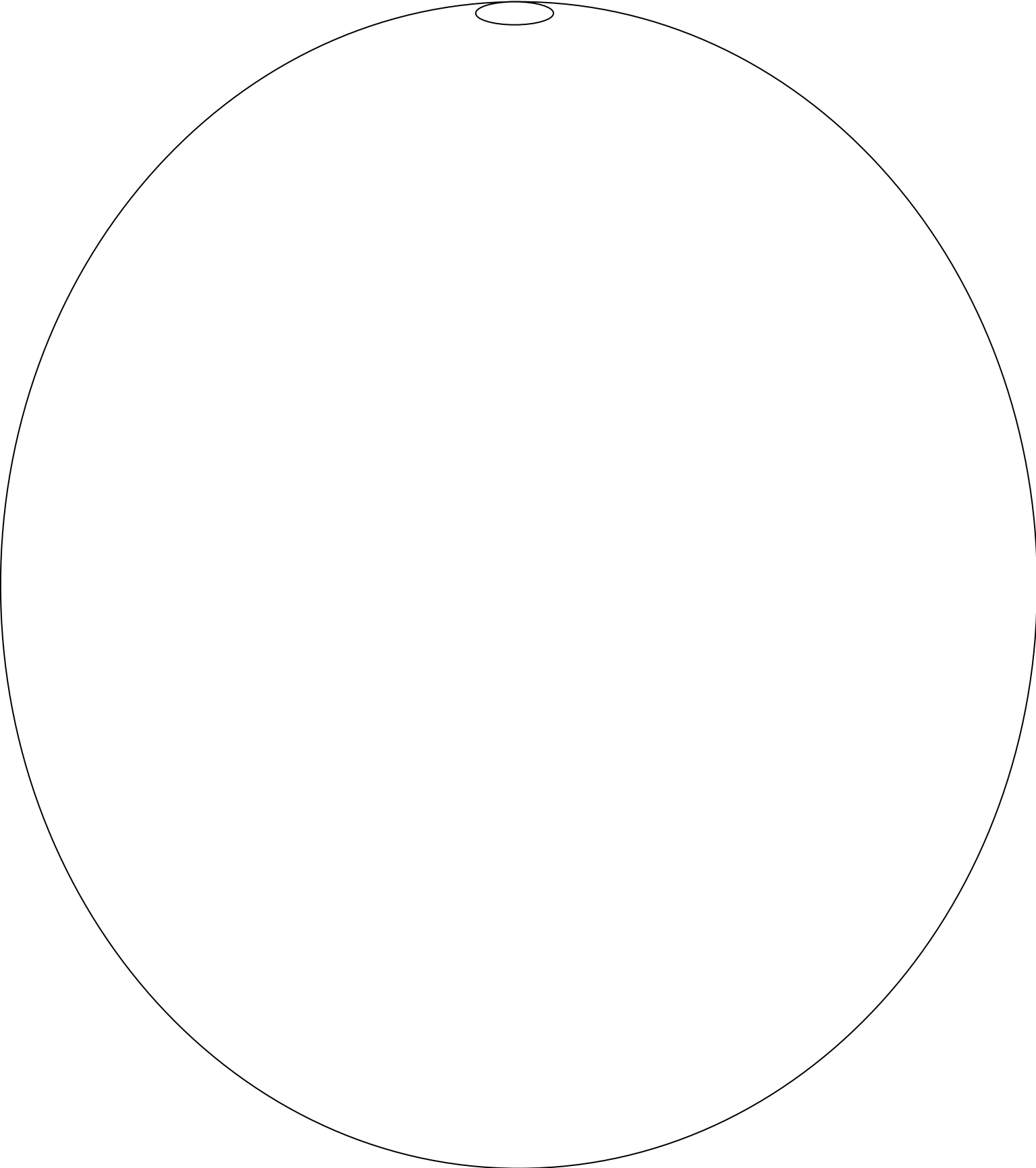

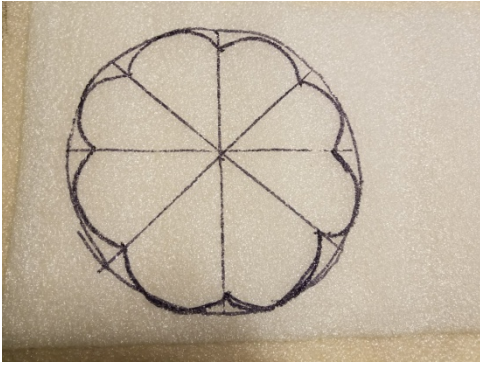
Supplies:

- .5oz [Merino Top](#)
- [Luster fibers](#) such as viscose, tussah silk or bamboo, also consider hankies & nepps
- [MC-1 Felting Batts](#) for stem
- [Wet felting Resist Material](#)
(your preference of thin, thick or small bubble wrap - we used our thick resist)
- [Mesh](#) or Plastic as a barrier
- [Olive Oil Soap](#)
- Water and Towels
- Felting Needles [42 Triangle](#) or [40 Triangle](#) or [38 Star](#)
- Earth Harmony [Needle Felting Foam](#)
- Polyfill or other stuffing

RESIST PATTERN -- OVAL PUMPKIN



For squattier, gourd style pumpkins, try this shape:



For simple pumpkins, I started with an 8" circle and then drew lines through it like a pizza. Draw rounded edges between each line. You can make these deeper if desired.



Cover in 2-3 layers of wool plus a design layer. Mine weigh .6oz - 1oz and had no thin spots.



While drying, stuff with fabric and tie yarn across the pumpkin within the indents to give it a little more dimension.

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
